# “From Worry to Wonder”

## A Christmas Message from Bishop

On June 19, 2020 our granddaughter was born. She was born three months into the pandemic. Her parents were worried. Her grandparents were worried. It is challenging enough to be pregnant and give birth in the best of times but to give birth in the middle of a worldwide pandemic is an even greater worry. We worried about the unknown dangers this virus might present to the mother, the unborn baby, and the new born baby. Our worries kept us up at night. Our worries were relieved when she was finally born, perfect in every way. Our worry gave way to wonder-filled joy. Worry transformed to wonder as we looked back to see how God was holding and carrying them through the unavoidable worry. Our worry transformed to gratitude and wonder watching for what God would be up to next in her tiny life.

It's December 2022. We prepare to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus. This Advent we come with our fears and worries too. We are living in the midst of challenging times in our country. The very foundation of our nation seems less stable. We each come with our own personal set of worries and fears about our families, health, finances, work, safety, the future...What is it that keeps you up at night? What are you worried about today?

Folks across our church are experiencing doubts and uneasiness about the future of their church. Does it keep you up at night? What are the threats to your church's future? How can the conversation move from fear and worry to wonder? As the miracle of Christ's birth is celebrated this season, we can move from

worry to wonder. We wonder what God is up to now in this day and age. Together we wonder what God's will is for the future of

our church. Together we wonder; how can we use the abundance and blessings, (what we do have and opportunities in front of us), to make a difference in Jesus' name. Now in that same region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. Luke 2:8-10a Shepherds living in the fields watched over their sheep to keep them safe. There were dangers that kept the shepherds up at night and plenty of things for the shepherd's to worry about in the cold night like wild animals, predators, thieves, & bad weather. There was so much to worry about, but one night an angel of the Lord, all shiny and bright appeared and transformed their fears and worldly worry to divine wonder.

To you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" Luke 2:11-14 Friends, you are precious, beloved, baptized children of God. We know that the antidote to worry is to trust in God.

During this Advent, Christmas and Epiphany season I pray that your worries will be transformed to wonder at what God is doing and promises to do in your lives and in our churches. May the miracle of Christ's birth transform your worries to wonder! I am grateful for your partnership in ministry.

*100 Devotions for Kids Dealing With Anxiety* by Justine Froelker (2022).

This book has 100 days of brief scripture based devotions designed for **anyone** (children, teens, or adults) who seeks spiritual and professional insights into coping with anxiety for themselves or for loved ones. The author, Justine Froelker, is a licensed professional counselor with more than twenty years of experience.

*Care and Prayer: Reflections on the Sacred Task of Caregiving* by Gunilla Norris (2022).

Most of us are caregivers—of our children, of our parents, of our spouses, of other loved ones, of friends, of people we work with. Gunilla Norris, a psychotherapist, writes, “The giving of care includes many things: love, responsibility, fatigue, humor, sadness, and God’s presence throughout it all. Above all, our faith reminds us that as we give love, we are also being loved.” In this book, she shares reflections from her experience as a caregiver that offer hope, strength, and support for each day.

*Finding God Again and Again* by John J. Spitzer, M.D. (2021).

When pediatrician John J. Spitzer’s cancer returned after thirteen years, he was forced to once again confront his own mortality and examine his relationship with God. In this book, he describes his spiritual development, what it was like to confront his own death, and how his relationship with God has grown over time.

*What Do Our Neighbors Believe? Questions and Answers on Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition*

by Micah Greenstein, Senior Rabbi at Temple Israel in Memphis, Tennessee; Kendra G. Hotz, Associate Professor of Religious Studies at Rhodes College in Memphis; and John Kaltner, Professor of Muslim-Christian Relations at Rhodes College (2019).

We are all children of the Book and all worship the same God. So how are we alike and different? This book addresses when and where each originated, their sacred writings, their leaders, and their essential beliefs. It also explores current ethical questions and issues, including the deliberate use of misinformation about Islam to bolster power and generate fear and the recent rise in anti-Semitic hate crimes.

*The Four Winds* by Kristin Hannah (2021).

Kristin Hannah is the *New York Times* bestselling author of more than twenty very well-written novels. *The Four Winds* takes place in the Dust Bowl of the Great Depression as Elsa and Rafe Martinelli struggle to keep their farm and feed their children. As the publisher says, it “is a rich sweeping novel that stunningly brings to life the Great Depression and the people who lived through it—the harsh realities that divided a nation and the enduring battle between the haves and the have-nots.” Hannah’s novels are very historically accurate and very compelling. You won’t be able to put this one down.

*This I Know: Seeing God in the World He Made* by Clay Anderson and Natalie Merheb (2020).

This beautiful children and family book was written and illustrated by a married couple who wanted to teach their children about God’s love and how it is reflected in all of God’s creation. It begins with this verse from Romans 1. 20: “For ever since the world was created, people have seen the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can clearly see God’s invisible



qualities—God's eternal power and divine nature.” You will love sharing this book with your family.

*Simplicity: The Freedom of Letting Go* by Richard Rohr (1991).

Richard Rohr, a Franciscan priest, is a modern theologian and spiritual advisor known for his many books about spiritual renewal. In this book, he encourages his readers to live lives of simplicity and contemplation in order to have a closer relationship with God and to know real happiness. In our very rushed society, his words are very timely and valuable.

# ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Please plan to attend

Zion's Annual meeting will be held Sunday, January 29, 2023. This meeting will follow worship. Any individuals that are active in committees or groups for church, please have your reports turned into the office by December 16th for the Annual report.

## Treasurer's Report

To keep everyone informed of the financial status of Zion Lutheran, we will be starting a monthly Treasurer's Report in the newsletter. The overall purpose is to be transparent about how Zion is building a culture of generosity and being a steward (manager) of God's gracious provision in order to fuel Jesus' ministry.

Through October 31, 2022, **income** received to the Current (general offering) was **\$129,884.88**. This money is used to provide financial support for the ministry budget expenses such as faith formation, evangelism, worship, staff salaries, property, etc. This amount does not include the 10% benevolence. Thank you to everyone who is going above and beyond to financially support the mission and ministry of Zion.

The ministry **expenditures** are **\$125,288.72** as of October 31, 2022. Our expense budget is \$182,685.29. We are currently at 68.6% of expenses. Thank you to the ministry teams for being good stewards.

As of October 31, 2022, the church's **undesignated cash balance** is \$32,648.90. This is money that is not specifically designated to a specific purpose, such as utilities, mortgage debt reduction, lawn mowing, GermanFest, etc. The undesignated cash balance is like our savings account or reserve fund when our expenses are more than our income. This can be quickly depleted if actual income doesn't match expenses.



As of October 31, 2022, our **benevolences (ministry to the world)** are:

As of October 31, 2022, the balance available in the **GermanFest/Crisis Bank** account is \$7,674.33.
