## Pastor's Ponderings

<sup>4</sup> *"Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. <sup>5</sup>You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.*

*<sup>6</sup>Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. <sup>7</sup>Recite them to your children and talk about them*

*when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. <sup>8</sup> Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, <sup>9</sup>and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.*

*- Deuteronomy 6:4-9*



These verses in the Old Testament are known as the “Shema.” The word “Shema” comes from the Hebrew “Hear.” Jews and early Christians used this as a prayer both morning and night, “when you lie down and when you rise.” According to the Encyclopedia Britannica, “The biblical verses inculcate the duty to learn, to study, and to observe the Torah. These texts and their appropriate prayers are consequently sacred to Jews because they contain a profession of faith, a declaration of allegiance to the kingship and kingdom of God, and a symbolic representation of total devotion to the study of the Torah.”

As we head into a new school year, it is a great time to take these verses and etch them on our own hearts. How are we growing in our own faith and in our study of the scriptures? How do we **hear** God’s voice in our lives?

Faith Formation is not only for children and youth. You do not “graduate” from growing in your faith or studying scripture when you are confirmed in high school. Faith formation is continuous and ongoing. It is for both youth and elders.

This newsletter has a variety of opportunities for ways in which you can continue to grow in your faith and to study scripture. The Zion website (<https://zionstratford.org/faith-formation/>) has additional information about studying scripture and being active in spiritual practices. Check it out.

The Zion Library has books and other resources for people of all ages. It's free. Sometime after worship or while waiting to pick up children from Little Lutherans/J-Team, explore the library. It's highly recommended. 5-stars!

Music is also a great way to learn scripture and grow in faith. Hymns and even contemporary Christian music is based on scripture, especially the Psalms and the Book of Revelation. This year J-Team/Little Lutherans are learning about worship and liturgy. Ask them about what they are discovering. What do you appreciate about worship? How does it connect you to Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit?

**And I can't help but put in one last plug for the class "What is a Lutheran?" taught by Bishop Laurie Skow Anderson, right here at Zion on Wednesday, September 14 from 6:30-8:00 p.m. All are welcome to participate. Whether you have come from a different faith background or it has been years since Confirmation, come learn again about God's grace and love.**

Remember, faith formation is for all ages. Being a curious learner helps us grow in our discipleship.

# Treasurer's Report

To keep everyone informed of the financial status of Zion Lutheran, we will be starting a monthly Treasurer's Report in the newsletter. The overall purpose is to be transparent about how Zion is building a culture of generosity and being a steward (manager) of God's gracious provision in order to fuel Jesus' ministry.

Through July 31, 2022, **income** received to the Current (general offering) was **\$87,043.50**. This money is used to provide financial support for the ministry budget expenses such as faith formation, evangelism, worship, staff salaries, property, etc. This amount does not include the 10% benevolence. Loose offering/initial offering is \$1,520.00.

The ministry **expenditures** are **\$95,692.92** as of July 31, 2022. Our expense budget is \$182,685.29. We are currently at 50.8% of expenses. September tends to be a higher expense month as we launch faith formation programs and ramp-up for the fall and winter programming and building expenses. Thank you to everyone who is going above and beyond to financially support the mission and ministry of Zion.

As of July 31, 2022, the church's **undesignated cash balance** is \$39,662.12. This is money that is not specifically designated to a specific purpose, such as utilities, mortgage debt reduction, lawn mowing, GermanFest, etc. The undesignated cash balance is like our savings account or reserve fund when our expenses are more than our income. This can be quickly depleted if actual income doesn't match expenses.

As of July 31, 2022, our **benevolences (ministry to the world)** are:

As of July 31, 2022, the balance available in the **GermanFest/Crisis Bank** account is \$7,672.88.

The **Building Fund** account balance is \$8,711.25 as of August 4, 2022. The loan balance as of July 29, 2022 is \$140,632.88. The monthly mortgage payment is \$3100.

Thank you to everyone who continues to support Zion's ministry in Jesus' name with financial gifts. It takes all of us together to fuel our ministry plan.

## Confirmation



## Counters Needed



## **Strengthening Ministry: Today, Tomorrow, Together**

*Matthew 13:32: "It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches."*

This passage beautifully illustrates an image of something so small growing into a vibrant network and support system. This, in many ways is symbolic of your Synod Endowment Fund. Since its planting in 2001, the Fund has continued to sprout new branches and has supported dozens of ministries by:

1. Encouraging whole life stewardship
2. Strengthening and resourcing the ministry of the synod and
3. Enhancing the ministry of the synod in addition to, and apart from, its yearly operating budget, with emphasis on, but not limited to:
  - o Strengthening congregational vitality
  - o Developing ministry for the next generation and
  - o Equipping and supporting new leaders through seminary debt assistance, training, and lay leader development

Since inception, the fund has grown to almost a half million dollars and has gifted over two hundred and fifty thousand dollars. In the last five years, the Endowment Fund has made gifts to ministries totaling over \$200,000 with \$81,000 of that total given toward Seminary debt assistance.

This year alone, the Endowment Fund gifted over \$47,000 to various congregations and ministries with almost \$20,000 of that total going to Seminary debt assistance. As you can see, the Endowment Fund has been actively supporting ministries throughout the church by not only speaking of God's Love but putting that Love into action.

At this year's April Synod Assembly, the Endowment Fund launched a two-year campaign to raise awareness of the Endowment Fund and to grow the Fund so that the work of the church and its ministries can continue to be supported and enriched. The theme for this campaign is: ***"Strengthening Ministry – Today, Tomorrow, Together"*** with an emphasis on:

- equipping and supporting leaders (seminary debt assistance and training lay leaders)
- strengthening congregational vitality
- developing ministry for the next generation

The goal over the next two years is to increase the endowment fund by \$125,000 and to generate future commitments of an additional \$150,000. The Endowment Fund is committed today and into the future to assist and support churches, ministries, and seminarians with their ministry journeys. **Therefore, the Endowment Fund is asking for your partnership through a gift to help ministries of the church in their journey.** Gifts may be cash or an optional future financial commitment. Whether you have much to give or a small amount to share, leaving a gift through the **Today, Tomorrow, Together** campaign will have long lasting impact. Together we are responding to the story of God's generosity in the world.

The Endowment Fund is only able to do all this great work because of people just like you who chose to make a gift to the Synod Endowment Fund. Because of your generosity, incredible stories are unfolding, and lives are being touched. It is truly God's Work, Our Hands.
