Pastor's Corner

Christ is risen! Hallelujah!

He is risen indeed! Hallelujah!

I always thought of the liturgical year--Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost--as a more leisurely way to mark time. That was before I was called as a pastor! I'm surprised by how much of my thought process revolves around the concept of BE and AE, or Before Easter and After Easter. As in: I can work on the graduation service After Easter; or, I'll have time for those calls After Easter; or, I must get those hymns chosen, bulletin sent in, or music arrangements made Before Easter. The church year seems to have so many deadlines and "musts" and "shoulds" that it's easy to get lost in those things rather than in the Story itself.

As I prepared the order of worship for my very first Easter Sunday as an ordained pastor, I looked in vain for the Easter template in Evangelical Lutheran Worship - the primary hymnal we use. There's an order for mid-week Lenten worship, one for Palm Sunday, one for Maundy Thursday, one for Good Friday, and one for the Easter Vigil. No special worship order for Easter. Then I remembered... there's a reason for that. The "busy-ness" of Lent and Holy Week and Easter Sunday had made me forget that we are an Easter people. No matter what the liturgical calendar says, or how active the congregation's calendar is, or what the chronological calendar tells me about date and time... we followers of Christ celebrate Easter every Sunday. The point is that I had been thinking about it all wrong, and maybe you have, too. Easter isn't just one Sunday among many; Easter is a way of life for the body of Christ. Easter is living one's whole life not just patterned after Christ, but as the body of Christ.

How are you being called to live your life as the body of Christ? Not just on Easter Sunday, but every day? I pray that all your Easters - all your days - are filled with love, service to others, and joyous thanksgiving.

Easter Message from Bishop Lauirie Skow-Anderson April 2023

Matthew 28 After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it... the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised, as he said... go quickly and tell his disciples."

Dear Northwest Synod of Wisconsin,

Join me and that great cloud of witnesses this Easter in the acclamation:

Christ is Risen,



He is Risen indeed, Alleluia!

The gospel reading for this Easter is from the book of Matthew. Matthew is the only gospel writer that records an **earthquake** on Easter morning. The women arrive at the tomb and are greeted by an earthquake, an angel rolling back the stone, and the news that their Lord and Savior wasn't there, JESUS HAD BEEN RAISED FROM THE DEAD. What? The women were filled with shock and fear. The aftershocks of this earthquake are still felt. The news that death doesn't win and is defeated by the power of God in Christ Jesus continues to shock and amaze us.

What if we imagined Easter not as a lovely spring ritual filled with pastel-colored eggs and candy but as the violent earthquake that it is? Few living in the Midwest have experienced an earthquake. A pastor born in California remembers her mother putting rubber bands on the kitchen cupboard handles so the china dishes wouldn't fall out when there was an earthquake. When has a death

of a loved one shaken the foundation of your world? When have you realized how fragile life can be? Christ's resurrection from the dead, his victory over sin, death, and the devil shakes up everything. It is the good news that can even shake us loose from our grief.

What if we experienced Easter as a violent earthquake more like a fresh egg dropped to the floor than one hard-boiled and beautifully decorated? What if the Easter Earthquake shakes us awake, shakes everything out of the cupboards and closets so we are forced to do spring cleaning and decide what to put back and what to throw out? What if we get rid of stuff that doesn't work and give more space to what's important? What is really important? What is God's will for you? What are our Easter priorities?

What if this year the Easter Earthquake cracks open and rolls away the stone from our hearts, shakes loose old ideas, breaks down rock-hard prejudices, and opens us up to new ways to love our neighbor and to share this amazing good news that Jesus lives? What new life might rise up from the rubble? What new relationships might develop? Like a chick struggles to break free of the egg's shell, new beginnings are rarely easy, but they are worth it.

The good news is that Christ's resurrection from the dead and his victory over death is good news even to those who have experienced a literal shifting of tectonic plates beneath the earth. On February 6, 2023, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake hit Turkey and Syria leaving over 50,000 people dead and hundreds of thousands more wounded, displaced, or homeless. More than 10,000 aftershocks have been felt since February 6 leading to more deaths, fear, and trauma. The aftershocks will continue for a long time.[1]

This Easter, in response to the earthquake that opened the tomb and to the good news that Jesus has been raised from the dead, I encourage you to give a gift to the Lutheran Disaster Response to help the victims of the Earthquake in Turkey and Syria. Treasurer's Report

To keep everyone informed of the financial status of Zion Lutheran, we include a monthly Treasurer's Report in the newsletter. The overall purpose is to be transparent about how Zion is building a



culture of generosity and being a steward (manager) of God's gracious provision in order to fuel Jesus' ministry.

Through February 28, 2023 **income** received to the Current (general offering) was **\$27,406.50**. This money is used to provide financial support for the ministry budget expenses such as faith formation, evangelism, worship, staff salaries, property, etc. This amount does not include the 10% benevolence.

Thank you to everyone who is going above and beyond to financially support the mission and ministry of Zion.

The ministry **expenditures** were **\$25,976.61** as of February 28, 2023. Our expense budget is \$238,486.82. We currently are at 10.9% of expenses. Thank you to the ministry teams for being good stewards.

As of February 28, 2023, the church's **undesignated cash balance** is \$19,576.92. This is money that is not specifically designated to a specific purpose, such as utilities, mortgage debt reduction, lawn mowing, GermanFest, etc. The undesignated cash balance is like our savings account or reserve fund when our expenses are more than our income. This can be quickly depleted if actual income doesn't match expenses.
