

Pastor's Corner



I hope you have all been having a wonderful summer! I've had a good one which included being able to participate in my granddaughter's baptism in July as well as a couple of day trips up to the Heinz cottage north of Merrill.

But I've been noticing some leaves turning; the sumac is becoming fiery red. The end of summer approaches.

I sort of felt this way all summer long—that things were changing, that creation was morphing into something else, that time was inexorably moving along. My family and I were invited to help clear out my uncle's home this summer, and it felt like a long, slow slide into autumn followed by winter.

I practically grew up in that house; our two families were knitted together by blood ties as well as interests, lifestyles, and aspirations. We genuinely liked spending time together, and we fiercely loved one another through thick and thin.

Seeing that familiar space filled with familiar things and surrounded once again by familiar family units was like autumn; we all knew it was the last time we would be in that place together. It was a sad and emotional process, but it was also a time to acknowledge that a new family would come to inhabit that same location which was so loved by all of us. New will come out of the old, and the property itself will be invigorated with the new life it desperately needs.

Sometimes our lives feel like autumn—winding down, slowing down, disappearing—and we grasp at what we feel we are losing

rather than accepting the change and welcoming the new life to come.

God knows our uncertainty and our fear in the face of change; God walks alongside us through it all. God assures us of new life, not only for us but for that which we must occasionally set aside.

We're beginning a new programming year here at Zion. You'll see more experimenting, and we'll evaluate the experiments we've already tried. We'll tweak the tried and true, and sometimes leave things behind to make room for something new. We'll also leave many things as they are because they already blossom and produce the fruit of faith in lively ways. Through it all we'll ask questions, and actively listen to responses.

Our congregation and the manner in which we behave as the body of Christ in this place can, will, and must change as we walk Jesus' way together. Autumn brings change, and Winter brings rest, and Spring and Summer are ready to pop up again with new life, but God remains faithful through it all.




Join us for Bible Sunday,

We have Germanfest annually at the end of October of every year. All proceeds from the dinner go to our Community Crisis Fund. Each Zion member household will receive 4 tickets in September that you can purchase, sell, or return them unsold. Each Sunday, beginning the last week of September someone will be in the narthex after each service. You may pick up more tickets to sell, turn in any money from sold tickets, or turn in your unsold tickets. Tickets will also be available in the church office from 8:00am-1:30pm, Monday-Thursday. Tickets this year for dine-in will be \$15.00 per adult and \$10.00 for children and all carry out tickets are \$15.00.

Our Germanfest dinner consists of Pork Hocks, Pork Roast, Sauerkraut, Potato Dumplings, Rye Bread, Applesauce and Cheesecake.

Treasurer's Report

To keep everyone informed of the financial status of Zion Lutheran, we include a monthly Treasurer's Report in the newsletter. The overall purpose is to be transparent about how Zion is building a culture of generosity and being a steward (manager) of God's gracious provision in order to fuel Jesus' ministry.

Through July 31, 2023, **income** received to the Current (general offering) was \$96,940.30.

The ministry **expenditures** were \$104,543.75. This means that our income (giving) has not been in line with our expenses by \$7,603.45. Note: Our ministry teams are well below their budgeted expenses for this part of the year.

Thank you to everyone who continues to support Zion's ministry in Jesus' name with financial gifts. It takes all of us together to fuel our ministry plan.

As of July 31, 2023, the church's **undesignated cash balance** is \$9,114.79. This is money that is not designated for a specific purpose, such as utilities, mortgage debt reduction, lawn mowing, GermanFest, etc. The undesignated cash balance is like our savings account or reserve fund when our expenses are more than our income. This can be quickly depleted if actual income doesn't match expenses.
