Pastor's Corner



Several years ago, I attended a conference called "Change (Almost) Everything." Brian McClaren (The Great Spiritual Migration, We Make the Road by Walking) and Rozella White (Love Big) were the keynote speakers.

The subject was change. As people who love Jesus, we must decide if we

are going to stay the way we are and continue to simply manage our decline - a decline being experienced by all Christian denominations in this country. Or, are we going to go out on a limb and trust God to give us a mission that might not line up with exactly how we do things right now.

Advent is a perfect time to be pondering questions about change and about God's mission.

Imagine having a pretty good thing going for yourself: you've got a good reputation, you're engaged to a stand up guy with an okay job, and you're getting married soon. One night, a heavenly being visits you and says, "Guess what? You're going to have a baby! In fact, you';re pregnant right now!" In one moment, every plan you had, every piece of security you thought was in place, is gone; swept away by the Holy Spirit. You and I would most likely be really upset about God upsetting the apple cart like this. "Things are just fine the way they are; why are you doing this to me?" But the bible records Mary's response like this: *Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word. [Luke 1:38a]* Can we respond in the same way as Mary to God's breaking in to our ordered, predictable, safe approach to being Christ's body? Are we ready to give up some of what is familiar and safe in order to embrace what God wants for us? Do we have the humility to admit that there are some things we are fond of that are just getting in God's way, and then let go of those? Can we summon up the courage to listen to new voices with new opinions about old things?

We have some big decisions to make in the coming year. Can we make decisions based on what's best for all people, or will we make those decisions based on what's best for only ourselves? Can we be courageous like Mary? What a challenge! What an opportunity! What a statement we can make!

The angel tells Mary: "Don't be afraid." [Luke 1:30] And Mary trusts those words and responds with faithfulness and trust, even though her life is being turned upside down.

And Jesus tells us: "Don't be afraid." [Mark 6:50b] Our response can only be to trust him.

Mary the Brave: Mary the God Bearer

As a young pastor and working mom, I struggled with the challenges of balancing work

and home life, often while carrying a child in my womb, arms, on my hip, in a front or back baby pack, or car seat. Now my children are adults, and I have the joy of

watching them carry my grandchildren. They do it differently than I did, their car seats are much nicer than the ones we had, but like us, they carry their children with much love.

I am still carrying my adult children and grandchildren and will always carry them, in my heart with much love. This Advent and Christmas season I'm reflecting on Mary, the God bearer. (In Greek it's Theotokos2.) Mary carried Jesus. Like all parents she carried

her child with love, but she is also the God bearer. It was a brave thing Mary did to bear God into the world. To love is a brave thing. It is a brave thing to become a parent. Mothers put their own lives at risk bearing a child in their womb and giving birth. It requires a measure of bravery for parents to bring a child into this world

filled with the bad news of climate disasters, gun violence, war, political upheaval, racism, food/water insecurity, and escalating health and higher education costs. History has painted Mary to be quiet, meek and mild, submissive to God's will, but a closer read shows us that Mary was brave. Mary was neither meek nor superhuman. She had grit. She was faithful, courageous, strong and brave. Most of all, she was human. Her encounter with the angel Gabriel, the messenger of God made her brave. She knew that her pregnancy was dangerous and she could die giving birth. She also knew that as an unmarried teen-aged mother it would cause upheaval in her family and community. She would give birth to Jesus during Roman occupation, a time of political unrest. Mary was brave. Her encounter with the living God made her brave Her encounter with God gave her bravery and the faith to see that if God was calling her God would also protect her. It revealed to her that God chooses the people on the margins, those overlooked and underestimated. Bearing God in the world was to bring good news and hope to those oppressed. May Mary, the God Bearer, inspire us all to be brave! This Advent and Christmas season, I invite you to be Theotokos, God Bearers. I invite you to carry the good news of Christ's birth, life, death and resurrection to all those we meet on this journey of life and the love of Jesus in your hearts always.

To the Council, congregation, pastors and lay leaders of Zion Lutheran Church, Northwest Synod of Wisconsin (NWSWI) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America is writing this letter to invite

you to participate in the upcoming election of our synod Bishop at Synod Assembly 2024.

All congregations have three responsibilities:

1. Each congregation should send the appropriate number of lay representatives and rostered leader representatives if available to vote at the Chequamegon Conference Assembly on a date between February 1st- 14th. Specific details will follow from Conference Deans regarding the Conference Assembly in which candidates will be nominated and sent to the synod.

2. The wide distribution of information regarding the nominees, once all individuals have been contacted, and confirmed their interest or have recused themselves, is key. Discussion, town-hall style meetings, participation by all members is encouraged during the Q&A sessions and sharing of the biographic videos should be shown or taken to those who cannot watch it themselves. Healthy participation is key in any election, and non- voting observers are welcome at all gatherings.

3. Each congregation should send an appropriate number of lay representatives and rostered leader representatives if available to vote at the NWSWI Synod Assembly on June 7-8, 2024 in Eau Claire, WI to elect a Bishop from those individuals nominated and confirmed. Additional nominees can be made at Synod Assembly per open Ecclesiastical ballot guidelines.

The process for the nomination of a Bishop was changed at our last Synod Assembly and details will follow from your Conference Dean, Reverand Elizabeth Bier Details and a full timeline is available on the website: <u>https://nwswi.org/synod-assembly-2024</u>

We look forward to navigating this process together, guided by the Spirit, in the work of the Kingdom of Heaven. With deep gratefulness, we thank you for your prayerful participation.

Operation Christmas

Sweet Dreamz has been selected as our outreach recipient for Zion's Operation Christmas giftgiving this year. Sweet Dreamz is a non-profit organization located in Spencer Wisconsin that provides comfort items to children ages newborn to 17 years who come from a home of

substance abuse as they make their way into foster care – things these children cannot take with them during this very hard transition. When a child is removed from a home, they are not allowed to take anything with them because it is contaminated.

Sweet Dreamz serves 45 counties throughout WI including Marathon and Wood. Sweet Dreamz provides these things to give them hope for a brighter future. Each child receives a homemade pillowcase filled with a blanket, a stuffed animal, pajamas, and a book – all specific to their age and size. Currently, the greatest need is for age and size 2T to 10/12. Pillowcases must be homemade. Sweet Dreamz currently has volunteers making pillowcases but will accept any homemade pillowcases and blankets or quilts. We will learn more about Sweet Dreamz on Sunday, December 3rd. Complete bundles and separate items from the bundle will be placed on the Operation Christmas tree. Choose a tag(s), purchase the item(s), and bring your donations along with the tag to Zion. Thank you and Merry Christmas! Envelopes will also be available if you prefer to donate cash and we will purchase the items needed to complete a bundle. The deadline to return donations to Zion is Wednesday, December 20th .
