PASTOR'S CORNER Dear friends in Christ.

I had an epiphany while driving to Wausau one day. As I neared Wausau, I drove across a bridge that I drive across all the time, looked to the right, and was reminded that the only thing that bridge crossed was another road. Not particularly exciting, so I drove on.

Not long after, I was on the same path, drove across the same bridge, looked to the right, and was immediately let down because there was no beautiful scenery, only the same boring road.

This happened over and over until, one day, I asked myself (out loud, mind you!), "Amy, you doofus, why do you keep looking to the side as you cross that bridge? You already know it's going to be the same road that was there last time."

Then I began to wonder, "Do I always look to the right or left as I cross bridges? If so, what am I looking for?"

Thus began several months of trying to be aware of my actions when I drove across bridges. Sure enough, I always look to see what I'm crossing—even when I already know for certain what's there. It would seem that I am always checking out other options, looking for something new, or observing changes over time.

Well, that made me wonder if the Holy Spirit urges us to do the same thing in our lives: check out other options, look for new things, observe changes, and act accordingly. We can be on the straight and narrow path, but what do we miss when we continue on our way without looking around us? How can we see new opportunities to share the love of Christ with others if we never look away from our chosen path? I urge you to start taking a peek at what's going on outside of your current path. Are there Spirit- inspired opportunities that we're missing? Let's talk about what those might be as we enter a new program year here at Zion!

WEEKLY:

Vacuum - all carpeted areas

Office space, Narthex, Sanctuary, all stairways, hallways, Library, Gathering Area, Family Center, balcony and any space utilized during J Team and Little Lutheran activities (seasonal). Hallway and stairs going down into the old Fellowship Hall from the Gathering Area.

Dust - all woodwork

Narthex, Sanctuary (including stairways and balcony), furniture, counters, etc. Please remove any/all cobwebs.

Restrooms - in office space and near Gathering Area

Mop the floor

Wash all surfaces of sinks and toilets, including walls near sinks and toilets

Fill toilet paper and hand paper dispensers (especially needed before and after weddings, funerals, special events, etc.)

Kitchen

Sweep/mop the floor

Change garbage

Wipe down counters, sinks, counters stove tops

Entryways

Vacuum

Lay School of Ministry

There's still time to register for the Lay School of Ministry, sponsored by our very own Northwest Synod of Wisconsin. From their website: "Courses are designed to help students develop a deeper understanding of the Bible, Worship, Spirituality, Christian History, and Lutheran Theology."

Classes are held somewhat monthly during the academic year, either in person or online. Nationally known guest instructors present classes on many topics throughout the year. The Northwest Synod of Wisconsin's Lay School of Ministry has long been considered one of the earliest and most highly regarded lay school offerings in the nation. It's like going to school without having to take the exams!

Tuition is \$475, and books for the first two years of the program run @\$250. (Pastor Amy may have some of the books you will need, so be sure to ask about those!)

Prayer stations, with prayer leaders, will be available, where you may privately ask for a prayer, personal blessing or anointing, share concerns or joys, and receive prayer.


