PASTOR'S CORNER

Walk with a humble and gentle spirit, patiently showing love and respect to each other. Let [the Spirit] weave you together in peace as you dance in step with one another in the great circle of life.

Dear friends in Christ,

By the time you read this, we will be right on top of election day in our country.

Given the divisive nature of our politics at the moment, I'd love to stop right there, but I can't. I can't stop there, because I serve the good news of God in Jesus Christ alongside all of you.

So let me remind you of one of the most important statements Jesus ever made; actually, one of the most important commandments in scripture:






Worship at Stoney River Assisted Living





Martin Luther held that all Christians are simultaneously sinner and saint—sinner because of our rebellious nature, but a saint because of salvation in Jesus.

On Sunday, November 3rd, we will remember those in our congregation who died during the past year and those whose names are submitted by the congregation. Names will be read during worship, and family members will have the opportunity to light a candle in remembrance.

Operation Christmas

Marshfield Children's Child Life Program and Ronald McDonald House have been selected as outreach recipients for Zion's Operation Christmas gift-giving for 2024.

Child Life specialists are available seven days a week and partner with doctors and nurses using evidence-based practice to minimize a child's stress, making their medical experience



easier. They embrace the value of play as they enhance growth and development of infants, children and adolescents. The Child Life team normalizes each child's environment and reduces stress of medical experiences by providing the following services: procedure preparation, coping and support, comfort positioning, inpatient pre-admission tours, therapeutic play, medical plan, pet therapy, music therapy, preparation and coping techniques for children who have ill parents, and grief support. The Child Life team provides services throughout Marshfield Medical Center medical offices, including the Outpatient Surgery Center and Marshfield Children's Hospital.

The Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) of Marshfield supports families with a hospitalized child by providing temporary housing at no cost to the family. The RMHC provides opportunities that strengthen children and families during their most complex and challenging times. The purpose of the Ronald McDonald House Charities is to support access to care, reduce financial burden, provide psychosocial support to keep families together, enhance clinical experiences and outcomes and help families resume normalcy. The house provides families with comfortable, private rooms, home-cooked meals, activities and all the comforts of home, allowing families to focus on the health of their child by providing access to the best medical care possible. In addition to the house, they partner with Marshfield Children's Hospital, providing a hospitality cart and family lounge. The RMHC supplies items for all three spaces, allowing them to serve even more families.

Tags with 'wish list' items from both Child Life and Ronald McDonald House will be placed on the Operation Christmas tree. Choose a tag(s), purchase the item(s) and bring your donations unwrapped along with the tag to Zion. Envelopes will also be available if you prefer to donate cash and we will purchase items from the tree.






