### PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends in Christ,

I am so sick and tired of having to rely on others for help.

This was brought home to me recently when my husband and I took a few days of vacation together in Milwaukee. Everywhere we went, he was dropping me off or picking me up at the door, transporting and storing my crutches everywhere we went, toting our bags in and out of the hotel and the car, carrying plates and cups at the breakfast buffet... well, you get the picture.

Others would patiently wait as I made my slow way through a door, or offer encouraging words as I struggled with a basic activity.

So, one morning when I was trying to manage my breakfast and find a place to sit, a very kind gentleman came up to me and offered to carry my things to my seat. As usual, I apologized for being a bother, and he very calmly stopped, turned toward me and said quite matter-of-factly, "I have no doubt you would do exactly the same thing for me if our roles were reversed."

That struck a nerve, because he was absolutely right. I would have thought nothing of helping someone who was struggling, and it would have been a bright spot in my day to be of assistance to someone else. That was when I realized that, although I need a lot of help right now, it's not about me at all. It's about how we live out God's love *together*—with, for, and on behalf of one another.

It is humbling to have to rely on other people for things which I feel I should be able to do on my own... frustrating to wait while others care for me... embarrassing to always be the one others have to wait for and prepare for and watch out for. I also know that we all need to be needed; we need to—and expect to—help others out of simple human kindness, compassion, and dignity.

Thank you for all you have done to make my limitations just one of the many ways in which you express God's love for all.
